Since NCSEA was founded in 1978 amidst the oil crisis, our impact and investment continue to grow to confront the most pressing issues in the energy space. YOUR MEMBER PORTAL



The Member Portal on our website is available to all NCSEA members. This is where our members go to register for upcoming events, access member-only documents, view NC's ROPC/CPCN filings, donate, and so much more! The Member Portal is your NCSEA one-stop-shop, so let us give you an introduction to its features.

When you joined NCSEA online, you created a unique username and password. These credentials don't expire and will be used to log in to your Member Portal.

Step 1: Visit the NCSEA website at <u>www.energync.org</u>

- Step 2: Click on the link for "Login" on the top right of your screen
- Step 3: Enter your username and password



Once you've logged in to your account, you will be taken to the portal dashboard with your account number and name. You will have access to the following menu items:

Dashboard

If you would like to edit any of the items on your dashboard, (such as: name, address, contact information, and business details) select "Edit Profile". This will direct you to review all of your

personal information. Please make sure to keep this information up to date, as this is how we will get in touch with you. The more specific you are with any additional information selections, the more effective we can be in our outreach to you. Select "Submit" and return back to your profile.

My Membership

This is where you'll go to find current membership information including expiration date and

membership history. All of your membership details and transactions can be downloaded as a PDF. Additionally, you have the option to set-up automatic renewals by clicking the "Manage Auto Renew" link.

Manage Email Subscriptions

Under this menu item you can update your email preferences by unsubscribing from emails and newsletters you no longer want to receive.
